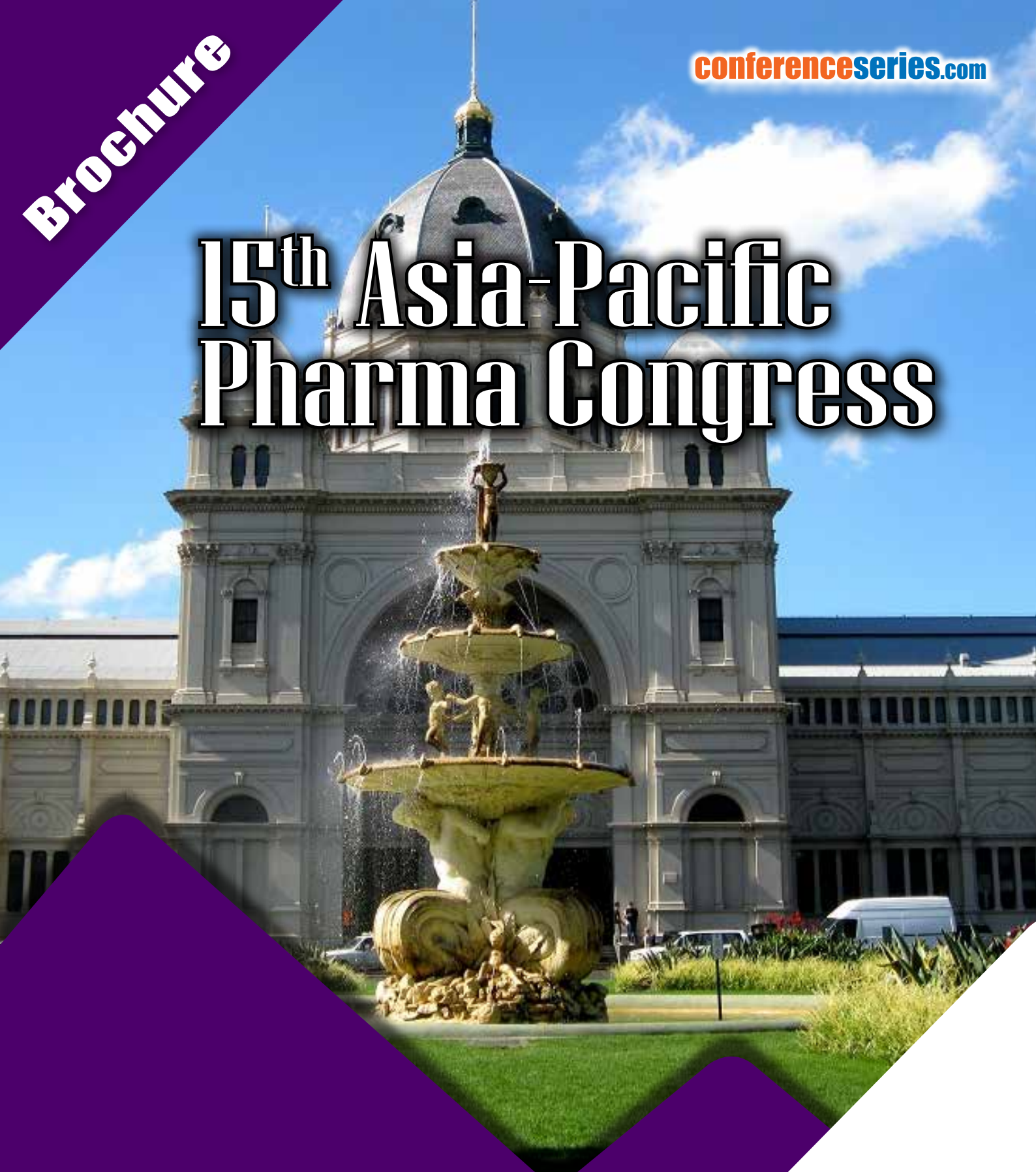

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Market Analysis

Importance & Scope:

Thanks to advances in science and technology, the research based pharmaceutical industry is entering an exciting new era in medicines development. According to an international research company, in 2012 the size of the global pharmaceutical market reached \$940 billion. In monetary terms it grew by 6%.
